

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Mano | Stewardship

Untouchability is the practice of discriminating between various individuals and groups based on their caste and the jobs done by them. Untouchability has been practiced for a very long time. It works on the Indian caste system hierarchy. The untouchables usually bear inhuman treatment because they belong to the lower caste. They have faced various kinds of discrimination in almost all places. Over 600 villages still practice untouchability in my state alone. Some people believe that the system of untouchability only continues in India, but it is also prevalent in other countries such as Japan, Tibet, and Korea.

Untouchability is a practice in which some lower caste people are kept at a distance, denied social equality and made to suffer as their touch is considered to be contaminating or polluting to the higher caste people. Can you ever imagine by touching someone you could be thought to pollute them? Untouchability started from the Hindu religion, and sadly, it exists today even in the Catholic church in India.

Religion ought to be a bridge that helps the people to have an easier access to God. But the Pharisees fractured this bridge with an inconsistent insistence on rules of traditions. Religion ought to be the network that makes the people come closer to God, but the Pharisees broke this network by an insistence on inhuman practices. Religion for the Pharisees had been reduced to enjoying places of honour and relishing the public acclaim of the common people, but completely overlooked humbling oneself and giving the glory and honor to God. So, the Pharisees were treating others as untouchable. But Jesus made them realize that they were untouchables.

The Pharisees are compared to an unseen grave over which people walk unknowingly. (Lk 11: 44). It was a ritual impurity for the Jews to touch the graves, and Jesus compares the lives of the Pharisees as a source of causing impurity and defilement to the people who came in contact with them. Because religion for the Pharisees had been reduced to merely carrying out some routines in the name of following God which were highly imposed though they were highly burdensome and impractical. The practice of the commands was much more important than the One who commanded utmost honor.

The various dimensions of the Pharisaic attitude can possibly creep into our own lives. We could be people for whom the offering is much more important than the One to whom it is offered; for whom the place of honor and the acclaim is much more important than the One to whom it all is fully due; for whom the law is much more important than the One who gives the Law; for whom the practice of the commands is much more important than the One who commands utmost respect and honor. "I desire mercy, not sacrifice" (Hosea 6:6).

Everything we are and everything we have belongs to God. We aren't "owners" of anything, we are merely "stewards" of the gifts God has given each of us.
