## Weekly Reflection by Fr. Mano | Stewardship

How was your day? Did you have a very busy day? We hear these questions often from others. Everyday is a busy day for many of us. Though we have so much to do, do we always do it enthusiastically? We do because we are obliged to do; we do because it is for our living; we do it because we must; we do it because we have to pay our bills. At the end of the day, we are burnt out or feel so tired. We don't want to cook dinner; we don't want to sit and chat with our loved ones; we don't want to stop by our homebound elderly parents; we don't want to help our kids to do their homework or play with them and we don't want to say our nighttime prayers. We work so hard to keep our family happy and healthy. At the end of the day, we can't spend time with our family. Then what is the use of being so busy? Are we missing something in our lives?

Enthusiasm is a very remarkable word. This word, 'enthusiasm' is derived from two Greek words and it literally means being IN GOD. Therefore, technically speaking, one who is enthusiastic is one who is possessed by God and is passionate about His works. One who is enthusiastic is one who is deeply involved in the concerns of God and is zealous for Him.

Jesus is the best example for being enthusiastic. Though Jesus lived for 33 years, only three years he was doing the mission of God. So everyday in those three years were so hectic. Let us reflect on the activities of a day in the life of Jesus. For instance, a sabbath day. And it has been a very long day for him. The day began with Jesus teaching in the synagogue. Then, He cured a man with a spirit of an unclean demon. Then, He goes to the house of Simon Peter and heals his mother-in-law. Personal affection and interest were extended to the chosen disciples of the Lord. Later, at sunset, He heals the various sick and suffering who are brought to Him. Immense compassion and mercy are offered to those in need. Finally, at daybreak, He moves off to a deserted place and proceeds to preach in the other towns. Unmatched dedication and commitment for the mission is exhibited by the Lord.

One of the outstanding features that is noticed in Jesus is His absolute tremendous level of "enthusiasm". Nothing seemed to tire the Lord. Nothing seemed to deter Him in His works. Nothing seemed to fluctuate Him in His focus. The reason for this was that He was enthusiastic 'in God'.

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me..." (Lk 4: 18). It was this "being in the Spirit" that was the recipe to our Blessed Lord being constantly "on the move" and in mission with enthusiasm!

His Presence brought about a wave of happiness and hope. His Words helped people to find new meaning and purpose in life. His Works enabled people to find acceptance and forgiveness in life. Is my life and the activities that I engage in, also "filled with enthusiasm?" Am I able to live my life in joy and happiness, knowing that I have a God who is deeply in love with me, and takes care of my every need and knows my every movement? Am I able to trust the Lord, especially in moments of crises and calamities, and be a beacon of hope in the darkness of tragedies and be an agent of encouragement in the thick of hopelessness?

Clothe the naked. For me, this might be one of the most reachable of the Works of Mercy. I often ask myself, “how many black sweaters do I

REALLY need?” Staying safer at home has brought to light how many clothes I have, and how many clothes I have not worn in months! In fact, these past months, I have learned that I can really do without many things, including a different outfit for each day.

So, how can we clothe the naked? Naked in Menomonic may translate to need. When I shop for clothes, it’s mostly out of want and not need, but many people really do need clothes. Foster kids often leave home suddenly without a suitcase of clothing. Job seekers may not have a suit or outfit that represents their ability or desire to work. Children going to school may need new shoes or fun “first day of school” attire. During the winter months, there is always a need for warm outerwear, for both adults and children.

There are many amazing organizations that help clothe those in need. The Knights of Columbus collect coats and boots each year; look for the giant canisters in church! Wisconsin Foster Closet keeps clothes for children on hand, and I just learned that even some schools keep a “closet” for children and teens in need. Let’s not forget our Babies! Options for Women accepts newborn and infant clothing supporting moms and dads as they choose life! How we purchase our clothes can help as well. Some used clothing shops use their income to support job training or provide housing for the homeless.

There are so many ways to make sure that everyone is not only clothed, but clothed with dignity and self-esteem. It’s a good time to look in our closets and pick a few things that we can share with others. Maybe a good challenge for me is to choose not my least favorite black sweater to donate, but my most favorite black sweater. What is a good challenge for you?




## CHOIR UPDATE

Dear Musical Friends,

Since our last rehearsals in March I have been thinking about and praying for all of you. Research on singing in this time of COVID has been explored in depth, and while the findings are mixed, the consensus is not: singing in a choir is not a good idea right now. First, the breath pressure necessary to get a good sound means that everyone is spreading a lot of particles into the air, and second, taking those good deep breaths that I am always preaching about means you are drawing air deeply into your lungs. Singing through masks isn’t feasible and sitting six feet apart means we can’t hear each other well enough to stay together and in tune. There isn’t a good answer, unfortunately.

So, this is where we find ourselves: **At this time, I am NOT planning on having any of our choirs rehearse or sing for Masses this fall.** As numbers and risks change I will continue to reassess the situation. The best thing you can do for your voice and our choir is to KEEP SINGING at home. Sing along with the radio or sing your favorite hymns at home to keep your voice in good shape for our triumphant return. Know that when it is safe to do so, I will be excited to make beautiful music with you once again!




## Why Cub Scouts?
