Weekly Reflection by Fr. Mano

WHAT IS INSIDE THE CUP?

You are holding a cup of coffee when someone comes along and bumps into you or shakes your arm, making you spill your coffee everywhere. Why did you spill the coffee? "Because someone bumped into me!!!" Wrong answer. You spilled the coffee because there was coffee in your cup. Had there been tea in the cup, you would have spilled tea.

Whatever is inside the cup is what will spill out. Therefore, when life comes along and shakes you (which WILL happen), whatever is inside you will come out. It's easy to fake it, until you get rattled. *So we have to ask ourselves... "what's in my cup?"*

When life gets tough, what spills over? Joy, gratefulness, peace and humility? Anger, bitterness, harsh words and reactions? Life provides the cup, YOU choose how to fill it. Let's work towards filling our cups with gratitude, forgiveness, joy, words of affirmation; and kindness, gentleness and love for others.

Last summer our church building was so warm as we didn't have air conditioning in the building. Thank God now we have air. It's nice and cool in the building. It's so comfortable to sit and pray quietly. It's because of your generous help. I am grateful for what you all have been doing for our parish. Though finances are still an issue for many families, you continue to contribute to our parish. People haven't stopped paying for the capital campaign. Though we can't get all our families in the church, still we must pay all our bills. I appreciate all you do for our parish.

Last year, before we began our capital campaign, we had a survey to see which are the projects people approved. Many of us thought the video projector and the screen in the church was unnecessary. I too believed this. But now, if you have been coming for weekend mass, you would realize that we need a video projector and screen. To keep people safe we don't use missalettes or a worship aid, so people can't follow the readings during Mass. Many also used the worship aid to recite the Gloria, profession of faith, and to say the St. Michael's and St. Joseph parish prayers.

So, the video projector and the screen have become a need of the time. Please don't say that Fr. Mano is always asking for something! "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives" (Mt 7:7-8). I trust these words

in the Gospel. The whole project comes to around \$49,000. I know it's a lot, but I thought of asking you. Please feel free to chat with me. I will be happy to get your comments about this. At the end of this month we are going to start our church basement project. Kindly keep praying for our parish and for all our families.

Update from the Pastoral Council

The St. Joseph Pastoral Council met on Thursday, July 25. The main topic of discussion was the approval of contracts for the capital campaign project work in Charles Hall. Denny Marach, chair of the Building and Grounds Committee, was in attendance and presented the proposed contracts approved by that committee. The council approved contracts for the following projects: asbestos abatement, remodeling of both restrooms in the church basement, new flooring in Charles Hall and the Charles Hall kitchen, and an upgraded sound system. All of the lighting in Charles Hall has already been converted to LED. The Building and Grounds Committee is planning with a volunteer crew to repaint Charles Hall. The council also approved the contract to upgrade the school gymnasium sound system, another project included in the capital campaign. These contracts will now be sent to the diocese for approval, after which the work can begin. The total cost for all of these projects will be \$177,583.69. Currently the parish has a balance of \$218,431.48 in our Moving Forward in Faith Campaign. Work will most likely begin in late July or early August.

Bill Kryshak represented the Finance Council at this meeting and presented the proposed budget for the fiscal year 2020/2021, which the Pastoral Council approved. The budget will be continuously monitored by Carol Stratton and the rest of the Finance Council throughout the fiscal year and will be adjusted as needed due to the uncertain landscape caused by COVID-19.

Fr. Mano informed the council that Jen Engel has been hired as the new DRE, and the search for a new principal for the school is ongoing. Council member Kimberly Kozubovska reported that surveys went out this week to families to help the parish and school understand interest and eligibility in the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program. No data was available to be analyzed as of this meeting, this will be further discussed at future meetings.

The council discussed ideas for the Fall Festival. Council chair Jason Horzewski proposed to still plan on having the fest in a modified format following Dunn County Health guidelines. The rest of the council agreed, Jason will work with Emily Revak and the rest of the festival chairs to develop a proposal for the fall festival on the same day, Sunday, September 20, 2020.

The Pastoral Council's next meeting is tentatively scheduled for Thursday, July 23. Please feel free to reach out to Fr. Mano or Jason Horzewski with any questions.
