

We are more than halfway to our goal! Please contact Carol if you did not receive a pledge card and would like to support the Diocesan Annual Appeal. "Even now, says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart." We all come to Church because at least a portion of our heart is for the Lord. But Jesus wants more than a portion; he wants our all. "Return to me with your whole heart," he says. I can be honest and say that I haven't yet given my whole heart to the Lord. No matter what you or I have done, no matter what blunders we've committed, whatever sins we have sunk into, Jesus continues to care about you and me. Someone here might consider himself finished, but Jesus is not yet finished with us.

You and I need a new mind, a new heart. Sunday by Sunday Jesus will tell us how to reach that goal. Today he invites us to take three steps. First is **fasting**, or refraining from some favorite food, for sure meat on the Fridays of Lent. It's small, but I admit when Friday comes I wake up thinking about crispy bacon, juicy hamburgers and Kentucky Fried Chicken! I encourage you to give up some favorite food - like dessert or coffee. I know of someone who gives up bread. It's her favorite food and she celebrates Easter with a warm bread roll. It's good to feel some hunger so we can appreciate God's gifts and hunger for God himself.

Fasting helps guide us toward a new mind and heart and it leads to a second practice, almsgiving. It reminds us that our sacrifices can help those who have so much less. This Lent we should try to learn what it means that we are "created for good works." The third practice is finding time for God. A new mind and heart do not mean squeezing in prayer. It means re-ordering our time. I know all of us are busy, but can you give at least 10 minutes a day to prayer? Try to spend at least one hour before the Blessed Sacrament in silence. You could take advantage of things we offer in our parish: Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 4:30 PM, daily Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, the Lenten Retreat March 23-25, our Lenten Communal Penance Service on Monday, March 30 at 6:30 PM, and the Feed My Starving Children trip on March 19.

Fasting, finances, finding time for God - three ways Jesus proposes not to make us look good in the eyes of others, but in the eyes of God. Others may not notice at first, but God will give us a new mind and heart. We will become a daily disciple of Jesus. "Even now, says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart." Have a blessed Lent season.

St. Joseph School Annual Report

Our Mission

St. Joseph School, serving children preschool through sixth grade, strives for spiritual, academic, physical, and social excellence within the framework of God, family, and community through Catholic teaching and devotion.

This report is designed to give a snapshot of what is happening in our parish school. It's challenging to convey on paper only the wonderful things that go on each and every day. You can be assured that the staff, faculty, and I are doing everything we can to educate the children in our care in the way of the Gospel.

Our Catholic Faith

SJ strives for excellence in faith formation by providing experiences for prayer, service, and sacraments.

- Students attend mass weekly.
- Students participate in adoration monthly.
- Classes prepare weekly masses, with student opportunities to read, participate, and sing in the choir.
- Students are trained as sacristans for school masses as sixth graders.
- Server training in Grade 4.
- Students participate in daily religion classes.
- Special activities for Liturgical seasons- Advent Wreath Lighting, Daily Reflections, Sacred Silence during Lent
- Weekly decade of the rosary in October and May
- May Crowning
- Students have daily morning prayer and song.
- Students go to reconciliation twice a year.
- Students experience once a month classroom visits from Father Mano.
- Students experience religious themes in academic areas as well as music, art, computer, and library.
- School day retreats added for grades 5-6 this year, additional grades added each year
- School wide service project partnered with The Neighbors that includes visits, student created seasonal art, and providing a choir at Thursday masses.

Academics

Strong academic programs have long been a part of Catholic school tradition. We follow the Diocesan curriculum and have outcomes determined for each grade and subject.

- Small class size (13:1 student/teacher ratio, 15 students average class size K-6) leads to more individualized instruction and higher performance.
- Recent STAR testing indicates that 75% of students are at or above year end benchmarks in reading and math.

Parent Involvement/SJPTO

- Parents assist in the office, classrooms, lunchroom, and playground.
- SJPTO, our parent support organization manages an annual budget of \$20,000+ which they raise to support field trips, teacher classroom supplies, transportation, technology, and so much more.
- School Committee, our parent advisory board, is comprised of parent and parish representatives and advise on decision making and school policy.

- Beautiful, modern building with recent upgrades to the roof and heating and cooling systems.
- Fully equipped computer lab and laptop cart
- SMART boards and iPads in every classroom
- Wireless access throughout the building
- School library with a collection of nearly 10,000 items for circulation.



Parish Retreat!

New Melleray Abbey Dubuque, IA June 8-9, 2020

New Melleray is a community of Roman Catholic monks who belong to the Order of Cistercians of the Strict Observance, commonly known as Trappists.

Retreat includes travel by coach bus, overnight lodging at New Melleray Guesthouse, some meals, tour of the Trappist Casket Factory, prayer with the monastic community, as well as time for quiet prayer and reflection. During our travels we will stop at the "Smallest Church in the World", Bily Clock Museum, St. Raphael's Cathedral, and the Dickeyville Grotto! It will be a fun-filled, faith-field trip!!


