

Weekly Reflection by Fr. Mano

Last week I was talking about why God has chosen Israel and what God expected from them. We are also chosen by God to be model people to this society. God wants to extend His blessings to all our families when we are faithful to the covenant we make with Him. As covenantal people, we are supposed to remember the love and sacrifice Jesus gave for us and follow His two commands in our daily lives. Let us be glad that we are the chosen people, and let's try to sustain His blessings upon our families by being faithful to Him always.

Last Sunday in the Gospel, we read Jesus multiplied the bread and fish. The most beautiful thing I learned from this gospel is that God will not send His children away empty handed. People came to Jesus to listen to Him and to get healed from sickness. But, He was giving more than the people expected. This gospel also gives us the reason why we should approach Him often. Unless you come to Him, unless you ask Him, He can't do anything for you. In Psalm 145:18, we read "The Lord is near to all who call upon Him, to all who call upon him in truth". The people came to Him, had everything they needed for their lives. Where do we look for our needs for our lives? How often do we come to God? How often do we call upon Him in truth?

I am grateful and thankful to our people in our parish. So many volunteers are helping me every weekend to celebrate Mass for our parish. We have three compliance managers: Tom Bilse, Jim Uhlir and Chris Bendel. They have taken charge to keep our church and our people safe to worship together. Ushers, greeters and the volunteers who sanitize the church after Masses do a great job. We appreciate their dedication as they either come early to church or leave late because of their service. Some volunteers are working every weekend. May God Bless you and your service for our parish. When I see all these volunteers' sacrifice and commitment to our church, one thing that comes to my mind often is where are our young healthy people? Don't they want to give back to God what they have received from Him? I do not know whether they watch Mass online with their families or they have other things to do, but we welcome them to join our volunteer team.

As I said earlier, we are the chosen people. God has called us to be covenantal people and to be model people for this society. In what way are we faithful to the promises we made to God? In what way are we the model for this society?

Summer Refreshers by Pam Sirinek



Safer at Home. This mantra has become familiar since Covid-19 entered our lives. For me it has been a blessing. I have been safer at home with my husband and

daughter and for the first few months my adult son as well. We all worked from home, ate meals together, and gathered in the evening to watch the news. For me, it was heaven having all my family "safer at home." But what about those who did not have a home in which to feel safe?

Shelter the Homeless is the third Work of Mercy. I feel like it takes a lot of courage to shelter the homeless. How many of us would invite a homeless stranger into our homes for the night? I truly admire those of you who raised your hands. We often fear the homeless, wondering how it happened that they have no where to live. We judge and maybe think, if not say, "get a job."

Several times a year a group from St. Joe's would prepare and serve a meal at Secure Waiting Space, a Catholic Charities emergency shelter in Minneapolis. I learned a great deal about homelessness. I learned much homelessness is the result of mental illness or addiction. I learned that many people work and still are homeless. I learned that the homeless need a cell phone to connect with family and to seek employment. I learned that the homeless desire the same love and dignity as those of us who have homes.

Locally, Stepping Stones helps those seeking shelter. They support and guide those in need all year, and in the winter provide warm and safe overnight shelter at Winter Haven. Once it is cold outside Winter Haven is always in need of volunteers, and indeed the people of St. Joe's have always been supportive. Winter Haven actually began and grew in the basement of St. Joseph Church. Habitat for Humanity builds and remodels homes for the homeless, and other groups build "tiny homes." Can we donate, or do we have the skills to build? Many children during difficult times find themselves in foster care, a home away from home. Foster Closet provides these children with clothing, blankets, and comfort items to help children feel at home in their new environment. What can we donate?

We are hearing now how Covid-19 has caused many to lose their homes because they have lost their jobs and are unable to pay the rent or the mortgage. Many families, moms, dads, children, are one paycheck away from homelessness. Is there a way we can help? Or do we need to ask for help ourselves? Shelter the Homeless is a call for everyone to have the opportunity to be safer at home, a mandate straight from Jesus.
